The regulators

The Austrian financial sector is supervised by:

- OENB

The Oesterreichische Nationalbank (OeNB) is the central bank of the Republic of Austria and is an integral part of both the European System of Central Banks (ESCB) and the Eurosystem. In public interest, the OeNB contributes to monetary and economic policy decision making in Austria and in the euro area. In line with the Federal Act on the Oesterreichische Nationalbank (1984 Nationalbank Act – NBG), the OeNB is a stock corporation.

Compiling financial statistics is a core task of the Oesterreichische Nationalbank. The OeNB is committed to providing a broad range of current statistics in user-friendly formats to the public and has established a statistics hotline to deal with statistical inquiries. As the OeNB is involved in the development of and complies with national, European and international standards and rules on the methodology, consistency and timeliness of statistics, it is well equipped to secure a consistently high quality of the data
